## Possessive Adjectives



### SUBJECT PRONOUN

<b>I</b>	<b>I</b> have a shirt.
<b>YOU</b>	<b>You</b> have a book.
<b>HE</b>	<b>He</b> has a pillow.
<b>SHE</b>	<b>She</b> has a dog.
<b>IT</b>	<b>It</b> has a bone.
<b>WE</b>	<b>We</b> have a bird.
<b>YOU</b>	<b>You</b> have a house.
<b>THEY</b>	<b>They</b> have a car.

### POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE

<b>MY</b>	<b>My</b> shirt is green.
<b>YOUR</b>	<b>Your</b> book is new.
<b>HIS</b>	<b>His</b> pillow is soft.
<b>HER</b>	<b>Her</b> dog is small.
<b>ITS</b>	<b>Its</b> bone is old.
<b>OUR</b>	<b>Our</b> bird is noisy.
<b>YOUR</b>	<b>Your</b> house is big.
<b>THEIR</b>	<b>Their</b> car is slow.

**YOUR = Possessive Adjective**

- *You need to bring **your** dictionary.*

**YOU'RE = You are (contraction)**

- ***You're** an excellent student.*

**ITS = Possessive Adjective**

- *The dog played with **its** ball.*

**IT'S = It is (contraction)**

- ***It's** very hot right now.*

# POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

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## Possessive Pronouns



A Possessive Pronoun replaces a *possessive adjective + noun* to avoid repeating information that is already clear.

- This book is **my book**, not **your book**. (*Sounds repetitive*)

- This book is **mine**, not **yours**. (*Sounds more natural*)

### POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE

**MY** My shirt is green.

**YOUR** Your book is new.

**HIS** His pillow is soft.

**HER** Her dog is small.

**ITS** Its bone is old.

**OUR** Our bird is noisy.

**YOUR** Your house is big.

**THEIR** Their car is slow.

### POSSESSIVE PRONOUN

**MINE** The shirt is **mine**.

**YOURS** The book is **yours**.

**HIS** The pillow is **his**.

**HERS** The dog is **hers**.

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\* We don't use *its* as a possessive pronoun.

**OURS** The bird is **ours**.

**YOURS** The house is **yours**.

**THEIRS** The car is **theirs**.

# Who's

**Whose** is a possessive pronoun like 'her', 'his', 'our' and etc... We use WHOSE to find out which person something belongs to.

### *Example Sentences*

- **Whose** car is this ?
- **Whose** notebook was stolen in the class?
- The child **whose** bicycle has been lost cried.
- The girl **whose** bag is red is looking for you.
















**Who's** is always a contraction for who is.

Who is → Who's

### *Example Sentences*

- **Who's** driving that blue car?
- **Who's** to be responsible?
- **Who's** that man?
- **Who's** playing the guitar?
- **Who's** your favorite TV star?
