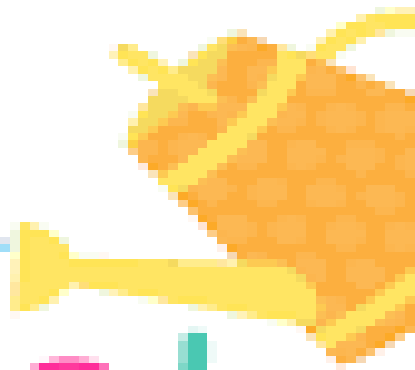

# Tourism



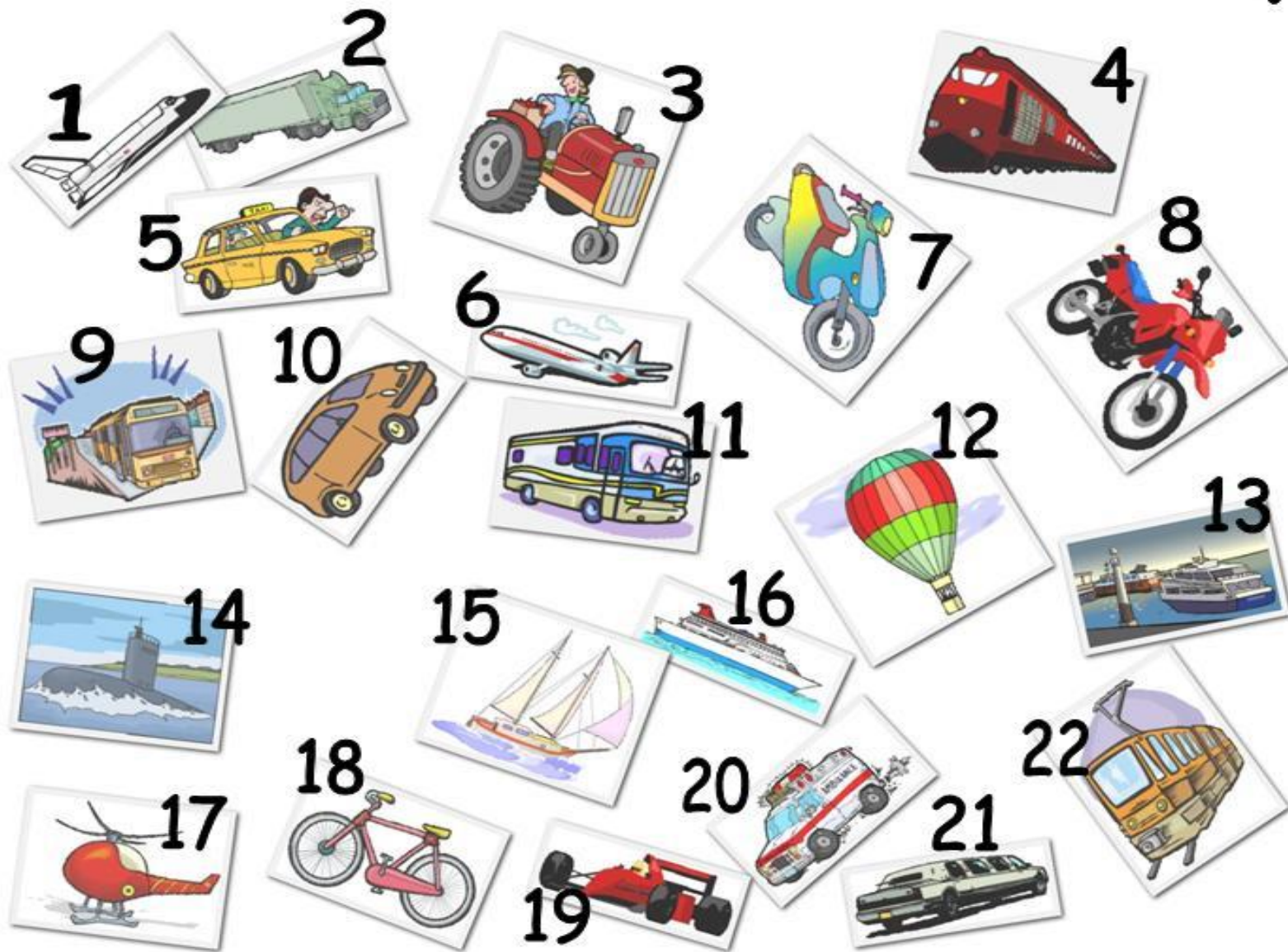
the industry of business providing accommodation, transport, etc

# Present Perfect Uses

- **Life Experience:** We often use the present perfect tense to talk about experience from the past, but we don't say when the experience happened.
- **Examples:**
  1. She **has lived** in India.  
Ella ha vivido en la India
  2. They **have visited** The Iguazu Waterfalls three times  
Ellos han visitado la cataratas del Iguazu tres veces
  3. We **have never seen** that film  
Nosotros nunca hemos visto esa película
